TENSE

PRESENT INDEFINITE TENSE OR SIMPLE PRESENT TENSE:

1. The verb shows that the action is mentioned simply without anything being said about the completeness or incompleteness of the action. One can say exact time is not definitely known.

It is formed as:

2. Subject + First Form Of The Verb
3. Subject (Singular Or Third Person) + First Form Of The Verb + S Or Es

It is used as:

4. To express what is happening at present moment.
5. To express custom or habit
6. To express general truth.

Example:

1. He gets up early in the morning.
2. He drinks tea every morning.
3. He takes exercise every morning
4. I get up every day at five 'o clock.
5. She goes to the temple daily.
